Annual Staff Reflection Day – Pupil Free Day

Each year our entire staff engage in our annual Reflection Day. The aim of the Reflection Day is to further develop the charism of our school and to give our staff an opportunity to engage in personal faith formation and reflection.

This year we were blessed to have Peter Bierer as our guest presenter. Peter is a professional lay ecclesial minister with over 20 years of experience in the Catholic Church across Australia and the United States. He serves on the Council for Ministry with Young People in the Archdiocese of Adelaide, providing strategic leadership and fostering youth engagement in the church's mission. His role includes promoting youth ministry, supporting existing groups, and guiding annual strategic planning for the diocese.

As this year is a Jubilee Year, the theme of our reflection day was 'Journeying Together in Hope'. Peter began the day by inspiring us with stories of his own personal journeys and how each journey has been an opportunity to learn, reflect and connect. We delved into what it means to be a Synodal Church and community and the importance of coming together and listening to the voices of all people.

Peter broke this down under 3 main points: Communion, Mission and Participation.

Communion: knowing each other, the importance of relationships and the act of listening *Mission*: what we do and how we do it *Participation*: everyone matters and ensuring every voice is heard

Peter also led us through a process of reviewing and rewriting our school's Vision and Mission statements by using a model called 'Conversations in the Spirit'.

This process enabled us all to listen to each other, gave us the power to be heard and invited the Holy Spirit to speak to us through moments of silence.

We will continue this work throughout the term, where we will also consider whose voices were missing from these conversations.

Together, we will endeavour to create a Vision and Mission for Star of the Sea which is a true reflection of how our entire community journeys together in Hope.
